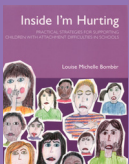
This event will give those working with children in an educational setting a framework for thinking about children who struggle in school. It suggests ways in which their difficulties can be addressed in individual or classroom contexts.

Who should attend?

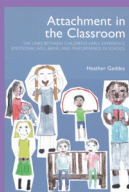
This event is for you if you work with children in an education or child health setting and want to develop your knowledge of attachment theory within the context of early learning.
